

I and my family took over the house Rosehill in 2000. The house provides a framework for our lives - including my great interest to work with glass.

Rosehill is situated high above the city Hundested overlooking the fjord and the Kattegat. The house was originally built by the Hansen family. House mistress Eva wrote a diary and it is the foundation of the local historical report on the old citizens of Hundested in their acts wrote themselves into the city's history. The gardens many roses and the high position gave the name Rosehill sense.

Glass art and craftsmanship has always fascinated me. Glass has its own playing field and therefore there are many factors that influence the finished product. Each thing is unique. I like to go exploring in the glass many opportunities - both in use as in art - crafts in the strict sense best. I make use of part of the ancient techniques when I am investigating glass in combination with other materials or its opportunities in its own beauty and shine.

Glass fusing.

For more than 4,000 years ago produced the Egyptians wonderful glass work in their primitive stoves. But their methods and knowledge disappeared when glassblowers have assumed all glass manufacturing in the first century after Christ's birth. Apart from a period in the late 19th century, where technology "pâte de verre" was used in France, one can say that the fusing technique was forgotten in 2000 years.

Only in the 1950s, it was glass fusing as it were reinvented or rediscovered. Some of the recognized pioneers of this old / new technique were Francis and Michael Higgins from New York.

Technique.

I work with a cold glass technique where pieces of glass are cut out of plates, formable and fused together into a sheet in the oven under high temperatures up to 900 degrees Celsius. The process known as **fusing**. Subsequently, the glass shape is given under a new heating process, possibly with the use of molds - **slumping**.
